



Walk Like An Egyptian

This term our topic in Year 4 is called 'Walk like an Egyptian'. In English, children will write non-chronological reports about life in Ancient Egypt and will also go back in time and imagine themselves as Howard Carter when Tutankhamun's tomb is opened for the first time.

As Historians and Geographers, children will be looking at the Ancient Egyptians (one the earliest civilisations). They will be finding out about how the Ancient Egyptians fit in with other ancient civilisations then go on to study their achievements in greater depth focusing on what can be discovered about their lifestyle and technologies. As part of their learning, we are arranging a trip to The British Museum so that children will be able to explore first-hand the artefacts and artwork of the Ancient Egyptians.

As Artists, they will be using their sketchbooks to record observations of artefacts and examples of art as starting points for their own two and three dimensional work. The children will also have an opportunity to improve their skills in art and design techniques, including drawing and sculpture.

As Scientists, we will be exploring sound; investigating how sounds are made and how they travel.

In RE, they will be exploring what is meant by worship and why religious people come together to worship. They will also explore and reflect on the concept of pilgrimage.
